


More Louisiana Children Need Access to Early Head Start & Head Start Programs

<u>In Louisiana:</u>

- Overall, the state of Louisiana serves only 29% of in-need children 4 and under in all publicly funded early care and education programs including Early Head Start, Head Start, and state-administered programs such as the Child Care Assistance Program.
- The cost of early care and education can be as expensive as **in-state college tuition**, with infants in a center costing over \$8,700 per year on average.
- Only 40% of Louisiana kindergarteners begin school meeting benchmarks, meaning 60% school-aged children are in need of remediation on Day 1.

Early Head Start and Head Start:

Louisiana has one of the **highest poverty rates** for children 4 and under in the country (28%). An estimated **80,073 children 4 and under are eligible** for Early Head Start and Head Start programs, yet only **24%** of these children are being **served**.



The Impact:
