Voters Disagree That There Are Enough Publicly-Funded Early Childhood Education Programs


Only 10% of likely voters think there are already enough state and federally funded early childhood programs and there is no need for local government to add new ones that require a tax increase.




Citywide Support for April 2022 Early Childhood Education Millage

More than half of likely voters support the April 2022 early childhood education millage.

On the April ballot, there will be a vote to enhance early childhood education in New Orleans through the levy of five mills for a period of twenty years with all proceeds dedicated exclusively to programs and capital investments that provide childcare and educational opportunities for children who have not yet entered kindergarten.
