## **Voters Support Expanding Access** to Early Childhood Education

More than half of voters support increasing access to early childhood education for all families in Baton Rouge.

Question Asked: There is an initiative underway to expand access to early childhood education for families in Baton Rouge. In general, do you support or oppose this initiative?

Note: Sample size is 200 registered voters



More than half of voters support paying an additional \$10 per month in taxes for the average family to expand early childhood education programs in Baton Rouge.

Questions Asked: If there were a proposal on the ballot to provide funding to expand early childhood education programs with a tax that cost ten dollars per month for the average family, would you vote for or against it?

Note: Sample size is 200 registered voters


## Voters See Doubling Access to Early Childhood Education as Good Use of Public Funds

A majority of voters think doubling the number of available spots for children under age 3 in community-based child care is an excellent or good use of public dollars.

Question Asked: Here are some ways the funds raised could be used for early childhood education. Please tell me whether each one is an excellent, good, fair, poor or very poor use of public funding for early childhood education.

Poll conducted by LJR Custom Strategies between September 15 and September 18, 2022, with 400 registered voters in East Baton Rouge Parish by telephone (landline and cell phone).


Poll margin of error is +/- 4.9%. Subgroups of the sample are subject to error of up to plus or minus 10%.






Voters with Children in Household
