
- 2 out of 3 young children have both parents, or their single parent, in the workforce.
- **70%** of children begin kindergarten behind their peers.
- Families in Louisiana reported paying an average of **\$9,491 per year for child care for two children under age 5**, even when they receive financial assistance or subsidized care.
- Families that don't receive any financial assistance or subsidized care report paying an average of **\$15,960 per year for child care for two children under age 5**, which can be as much as public college tuition.

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 4

There are **33,730 children in need from** birth through age **4**.

Yet only 30% can access publicly funded seats, leaving over 23,500 children unserved.

Only 24% of children enter kindergarten on track.

THE IMPACT

- Lack of access to quality, reliable child care for working parents costs Louisiana employers **\$762 million per year**, and results in a **\$1.3 billion loss** for Louisiana's economy.
- **Over half of parents** experienced some sort of adjustment to their work or school schedule to provide child care in the previous six months.
- The loss of full-time child care is associated with **employment disruptions**, including employer-related costs for employees' time lost from late arrivals or early departures, absences from work, and decreased productivity.
